Results of Operations



1H FY3/21

- COVID-19 affected our business performance from the start of FY3/21
- Sales decreased as the fiscal year started with the lower number of students at SEIGAKUSHA Group. Earnings decreased because reduced costs resulting from lower purchases of teaching materials and cancellations of study camps and other events could not cover the decline in sales

FY3/21 Forecasts

- A decrease in the number of students from FY3/20 during the entire fiscal year because of the decline in the number of students at the beginning of FY3/21
- Lower sales and earnings mainly because of a decrease in the number of students, a shorter period for training seminars, and still no gov't decision about when to start allowing new foreign students to enter Japan
- Demand is strong for face-to-face lessons; Restarting new school openings in the second half
 Plan to open the first school in Chiba in November 2020 (FreeStep Individual Tutoring Institute Gyotoku school)





Business Segment Sales








First Half of FY3/21

Number of Students at SEIGAKUSHA Group Schools




Number of Students and Schools



Nursing Care Advancement Class

A class for people who want to live and work for many years in Japan

Specialized skills and national gov't qualifications are required to receive a working visa in the nursing care field. A shortage of 370,000 nursing care personnel is expected in Japan in 2025. This Kaisei Academy program will enable foreign students to find jobs in this field and help reduce this shortage.

Loan-based scholarship

- Nursing care facilities where students plan to work pay all expenses while students are at the Kaisei Academy Japanese Language School.
- After graduation from a school specializing in nursing care and welfare, students work at the facilities that paid their expenses and repay the cost of their classes to these facilities.

Newspaper Scholarship Student Class

A class for students who want to advance their educations while using the newspaper scholarship program

Grant-based scholarship

- The Newspaper Sales Employee Aid Association pays all expenses for students at the Kaisei Academy Japanese Language School.
- Students study at the Japanese language school and deliver the morning and evening editions of newspapers.

Overview of "STEAM Library" business

One of the modern educational keywords common to the world is "STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts (humanities, arts, design, etc.) and Mathematics").

In June 2019, the Ministry of Economy, Trade and Industry compiled the "Future Classroom" vision and set "STEAM learning" as one of the important pillars of future educational reform.

The contents posted in the library are organized in consideration of the 17 themes of SDGs that children who will become "creators of the future society" should challenge, and are integrated and interdisciplinary social issues that are not bound by the framework of conventional subjects. Themes of life tasks that are familiar to students will be also prepared.

It is composed of main teaching materials (videos, etc.) + supplementary teaching materials for elementary to high school students, and by devising ways to make it easier to use in classes at schools, such as linking with the curriculum guidelines and posting teaching plans and teaching plans, "STEAM of learning" will be expanded and popularized. In addition, themes include AI, energy, mobility and disaster prevention which are connected to society, and content of teaching materials are related to SDGs. Private operators and high schools, universities, and research institutions work together to make the content development.

From March 2021, everyone can access the digital library and use it for classes and home study.

More written problems in exams

- Entrance exams will have more problems requiring written responses due to the Ministry of Education's new emphasis on the ability to think, make judgments and be expressive as key aspects of academic skills.
- It is difficult to make self-assessment for students, while teachers need more time for grading.

Grade Master

- A revolutionary Al-based system that automatically grades written responses to exam questions
- Increases the number of times students can practice; produces grades immediately at low cost and a high degree of accuracy and consistency

Utilization and planned use

- The BASIC.StudyCamp* program of four universities started using Grade Master on December 1, 2020.
- Grade Master will be incorporated in SEIGAKUSHA's entrance exam preparation programs starting in FY3/22 and utilized for both classes and home study.


