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1. Qualitative Information on Quarterly Consolidated Financial Performance

(1) Explanation of Results of Operations

During the first half of the fiscal year ending December 31, 2025 (January 1, 2025 to June 30, 2025), the Japanese economy continued to recover modestly, supported by improvements in the employment and income environments and the effects of various government policies. Nonetheless, the future remains uncertain, given concerns such as soaring commodity and other prices and the impact of the U.S. trade policies on the global economy.

The IT industry, in which the Headwaters Group operates, has continued to grow steadily, reflecting many innovations, notably artificial intelligence (AI) and the digital transformation (DX). In particular, the emergence and evolution of generative AI and AI agents are leading to new ways to deal with Japan's falling working age population and other social issues. These technologies are also making contributions to creating new business models and promoting innovations.

During the first half of 2025, the technological advances in generative AI and AI agents were remarkable. Regarding AI-driven development (vibe coding), which has begun to be used mainly by IT engineers, the Group is working on validation for the purpose of improving productivity. The validation has found that using AI for certain processes of Headwaters in-house service development (including code generation, implementation of new functions, bug survey and analysis, creation of specifications, code review, test code creation, and creation of operational design documents) is likely to reduce labor by 30% to 92%. However, new points needing improvement began to be identified in the process of introduction. By addressing these points, the Group has been building a more efficient, stable development system.

Moreover, the Group is using Microsoft Copilot and other AI assistants to streamline planning, proposal, research, and sales activities, among other tasks. The Group uses the expertise it gains through these initiatives to provide support for clients' in-house production, workshops, hackathons, and other activities. It has expanded them into onboarding activities for instilling in work sites the value and use cases of new technologies.

However, the Group currently faces the important issue of how to integrate the vast amount of data owned by companies with the convenience of generative AI and AI agents for practical application. Action needs to be taken in multiple aspects, including data quality control, security, integrity with business processes, and skill sets of human resources. Ongoing consideration and initiatives are needed.

The Headwaters Group has been stepping up its sales activities and reviewing its client groups to address the issue of seasonal fluctuations, which became significant in the first half of the previous fiscal year. The Group has shifted its main target clients to loyalty clients with sales of 1 trillion yen or more, and has set up a BizDev team with Headwaters Consulting, enhancing proposal and sales activities for projects to be launched in April or later, in addition to deepening relations with existing clients. The Group ran a booth at Microsoft AI Tour Tokyo held in March, which was hosted by Microsoft. This has bolstered the Group's presence, which has led to progress in the reinforcement of alliance structure for winning accounts. As a result, the Group has continued to receive many projects on referral from Microsoft, and has been implementing projects by demonstrating its ability to provide support and on-site solutions, in addition to making plans and proposals based on its track record.

During the first half of 2025, the conversion of clients into loyalty clients, a key initiative for the Group in recent years in the two service categories of AI Integration Services and DX Services, contributed significantly to the increase in unit sales prices. In the AI solutions business, demand has grown across a broad range of industries, and multiple projects are being carried out in parallel.

Non-operating expenses arising from a loss on valuation of derivatives was also generated in the first half of 2025. The purchase of derivatives was conducted as part of the stock acquisition associated with the capital and business alliance in 2024 and as such does not fall under speculative transactions.

The Headwaters Group divides the AI solutions business into the three service categories.

- AI Integration Services: Consulting and development services for AI agents, Microsoft Copilot, edge AI, data

platform construction, and other services

- DX Services: Platform development, DX consulting, Azure cloud development, low-code

development and other activities

- Product Services: Headwaters services, sales agent operations including cloud utilization fees

AI Integration Services

The Group has been expanding its service lineup for generative AI and AI agents in addition to projects related to IoT-based edge AI and small scale language models (SLM). Consequently, the Group is focusing its efforts on advancing projects using generative AI and AI agents, in an effort to reinforce its systems enabling it to respond flexibly to client needs and to expand its technological domains.

Specifically, the Group provided a solution using edge AI cameras to the year 2024 problem in the logistics industry. It has also provided a solution in the offline environment, which improves work efficiency by using small scale language models (SLM). For the financial and manufacturing industries, the Group provides technical consulting related to planning and architecture, in addition to holding workshops and hackathons targeting the business use of AI agents. It is also running multiple AI-agent-related projects targeting client services and business use.

Meanwhile, in response to an increase in business with enterprises, the Group handles vast amounts of client business data on the data platform, which enables efficient learning by generative AI and AI agents. For data analysis and visualization on the platform and development using generative AI and AI agents, the Group has built a system that enables it to provide a comprehensive lineup of services. These serves range from those in the planning and proposal phase, including facilitating understanding of technologies and creating business ideas through workshops, hackathons, and other events, to the provision of deliverables with sufficient accuracy and quality, and further, to the implementation of projects with clients including support for a shift to in-house production. Through these initiatives, the Headwaters Group has earned a strong reputation from clients as a rare entity that has both technological and practical capabilities in the business use of generative AI and AI agents.

In the first half of 2025, sales from AI Integration Services increased 54.1% year on year to 1,032 million yen thanks to the growth of generative AI projects and the expansion of sales of edge AI projects.

DX Services

The Group's DX service projects include platform development for cloud services centered on Microsoft Azure, consultation for companies' DX initiatives, and low-code development to improve operational efficiency. We primarily provide services such as modernization, which entails updates and improvements to old systems using the latest technologies and methods, and support for the internalization of various processes using Microsoft Power Platform and other low-code tools. Companies' actions for DX have steadily continued from the first half of 2024.

During the first half of 2025, some DX service projects transitioned to development and operation projects using generative AI and AI agents, and sales also moved from the sales category of DX Services to that of AI Integration Services. As a consequence, sales of DX Services decreased 7.9% year on year, to 551 million yen.

Product Services

Product Services are operated based on two profit models that are not dependent on person-months.

- In-house service model: initial setup fee plus monthly license fees for the SyncLect in-house service
- Other companies' service model: cloud service utilization fees (collected monthly) and agency model for the purchase and sale of IoT equipment

During the first half of 2025, the Group pressed ahead with the development of services focused on SyncLect Generative AI, a generative AI utilization platform, and SyncLect AI Agent, an AI agent utilization platform. At present, groups of clients who make upfront investments in new technological domains such as generative AI and AI agents tend to attach more importance to individually customized development than to the use of products. Accordingly, in the first half of 2025, sales of many generative AI and AI agent projects were posted as sales of AI Integration Services. The Group expects that steadily reflecting information about client needs and expertise acquired through these projects in SyncLect services will lead to an increase in the number of companies introducing AI agents and to the generalized use of multi-agent systems. The Group intends to ensure that the SyncLect services, for which it is absorbing knowledge at present, contribute to sales increase with a license model as one-size-fits-all services that do not need customization.

The first half of 2025 was a period for improving product functions, and Product Services sales decreased 14.6% year on year, to 53 million yen.

As a result, net sales for the first half of 2025 increased 22.9% year on year, to 1,637 million yen. The Group posted an operating loss of 24 million yen (operating profit of 151 million yen in the first half of 2024), an ordinary loss of 75 million yen (ordinary profit of 150 million yen in the first half of 2024), and a loss attributable to owners of parent of 52 million yen (profit attributable to owners of parent of 100 million yen in the first half of 2024).

The Headwaters Group will continue to operate in a single business segment, AI Solutions, with the goal of using AI to provide an even larger lineup and higher level of services for clients.

(2) Explanation of Financial Position

(i) Assets, liabilities and net assets

Assets

Total assets at the end of the first half of 2025 stood at 1,662 million yen, a decrease of 137 million yen from the end of 2024.

Current assets totaled 1,363 million yen at the end of the first half of 2025, a decrease of 96 million yen from the end of 2024. This was mainly due to a decrease of 102 million yen in accounts receivable - trade and contract assets, partially offset by an increase of 6 million yen in work in process. Non-current assets dropped 40 million yen from the end of 2024, to 299 million yen. This mainly reflected a decrease of 41 million yen in investment and other assets.

Liabilities

Total liabilities at the end of the first half of 2025 stood at 448 million yen, a decrease of 79 million yen from the end of 2024. This was largely due to a decrease of 91 million yen in income taxes payable, despite an increase of 17 million yen in accounts payable - other.

Net assets

Total net assets at the end of the first half of 2025 were 1,214 million yen, a decrease of 57 million yen from the end of 2024. This was mainly attributable to a decrease in retained earnings of 52 million yen resulting from the posting of loss attributable to owners of parent.

(ii) Cash flows

The balance of cash and cash equivalents (hereinafter, "cash") decreased 10 million yen from the end of 2024 to a total of 833 million yen at the end of the first half of 2025.

The following is a summary of cash flows and major factors in the first half of 2025.

Cash flows from operating activities

Net cash provided by operating activities was 2 million yen (202 million yen provided in the first half of 2024).

This was mainly due to subsidies received of 1 million yen.

Cash flows from investing activities

Net cash used in investing activities was 8 million yen (11 million yen used in the first half of 2024).

This was a result mainly of 8 million yen for the purchase of property, plant and equipment.

Cash flows from financing activities

No cash flow was generated from financing activities.

Changes in Accounting Policies

(Application of Accounting Standard for Current Income Taxes, etc.)

Headwaters has applied Accounting Standard for Current Income Taxes (Accounting Standards Board of Japan (ASBJ) Statement No. 27, October 28, 2022; hereinafter referred to as the "Revised Accounting Standard 2022") effective from beginning of the first half of 2025.

The amendment to categories in which current income taxes should be recorded (taxes on other comprehensive income) follows the transitional treatment prescribed in the proviso of paragraph 20-3 of the Revised Accounting Standard 2022 and the transitional treatment prescribed in the proviso (2) of paragraph 65-2 of the Implementation Guidance on Tax Effect Accounting (ASBJ Guidance No. 28, October 28, 2022; hereinafter referred to as the "Revised Implementation Guidance 2022"). This change in accounting policy has no impact on the interim consolidated financial statements.

For the amendment related to the revised accounting treatment for consolidated financial statements when gains or losses on sale of shares in subsidiaries resulting from transactions between consolidated companies were deferred for tax purposes, the Revised Implementation Guidance 2022 has been applied since the beginning of the first half of 2025. This change in accounting policies is applied retrospectively, and the interim and fiscal year consolidated financial statements for the previous fiscal year presented herein reflect the retrospective application of this standard. This change in accounting policy has no impact on the interim and fiscal year consolidated financial statements for the previous fiscal year.

Significant Subsequent Events

(Acquisition of shares of a company, making it an equity-method affiliate)

Headwaters resolved, at a meeting of the Board of Directors held on August 14, 2025, to acquire shares of BBD Initiative Inc. (1,599,100 shares, 26.1%) and make it an equity method affiliate. It concluded a share transfer agreement on the same date, planning to acquire the shares on August 29, 2025. This will make BBD Initiative an equity-method affiliate of Headwaters.

(1) Purpose of the acquisition of shares

Headwaters works on artificial intelligence (AI) transformation, SyncLect multi-AI platform, and other AI solutions, as well as DX consulting, support for the construction of cloud computing platforms, and other services. In particular, it has Japan's No. 1 implementation capability in the Data & AI domain of Microsoft, and boasts advanced technological capabilities and an extensive track record. For instance, it won the AI Innovation Partner of the Year Award at the Microsoft Japan Partner of the Year 2024. Headwaters also excels in high-precision AI agents and technologies for automating workflow (percentage of correct answers: 99%) that it developed on its own. Headwaters has been supporting the introduction of advanced AI by mainly targeting major enterprises. However, it has faced challenges in having its SaaS products for small and medium enterprises introduced by more companies. It has therefore been seeking sales channels that will enable it to reach a wider range of companies.

Meanwhile, BBD Initiative Inc. provides DX support (system development and SES), BPO services, and subscription-based services. It mainly targets the market of small and medium enterprises with 999 or fewer employees each (approx. 1.7 million companies). It focuses on increasing average revenue per account (ARPA), proposing complex services and enhancing peripheral services through M&A. Reflecting strong demand for SES and BPO, this company has more than 200 engineers. BBD Initiative Inc. was seeking a way to use AI technologies, aiming to provide services with higher added value.

The two companies have decided to form this capital and business alliance to combine their strengths (Headwaters' capability of implementing advanced AI and BBD Initiative's extensive customer base of small- and medium-sized enterprises) and to overcome the respective challenges they face (namely, Headwaters' need to expand its sales channels and BBD Initiative's need to increase the added value of its services), with the aim of achieving their shared vision: A next-generation workstyle with co-creation by people and AI, originating from Japan.
